Mine/ERW Risk Education: During the 4th quarter of 1397, in total 175,447 people received mine/ERW risk education in 270 communities. Of this figure, 31.1% were female, 68.9% were male and 56.3% were children.

Workforce: The MAPA workforce for the 4th quarter of 1397 was 7,188 people, out of which 6,140 staff (85.4%) were part of the humanitarian organizations and 1,048 (14.6%) were part of commercial companies. Out of 49 national and international mine action organizations, 11 NGOs and 2 commercial companies were operational during the quarter.

Funding Status (1397 / 2018): The table below demonsrates funding target and budget which has been confirmed for the year 1397. Funding to the MAPA is channeled through the UNMAS-managed Voluntary Trust Fund (VTF) and bilaterally through donor contracts with implementing partners.
