Explosive Ordnance Risk Education (EORE): During the 2nd quarter of 1399, in total 232461 people received explosive ordnance risk education in 218 communities. Out of the given figure, 16% were female and 84% were children.

Workforce: The MAPA workforce for the 2nd quarter of 1399 was 5,647 people, out of which 5,451 staff (96.5%) were part of the humanitarian organizations and 196 (3.5%) were part of commercial companies. Out of 49 national and international mine action organizations, 9 NGOs and 6 commercial companies were operational during the quarter.

Funding Status (1399 / 2020): The table below demonstrates funding target and budget which has been confirmed for the year 1399. Funding to the MAPA is channeled through the UNMAS-managed Voluntary Trust Fund (VTF) and bilaterally through donor contracts with implementing partners.
